Amid the sirocco of international sectarian conflict and domestic cacophony of poisonous partisanship, quieter voices have a hard time being heard, but *Rhythm & Roots* is employing inventive tactics in this benefit concert. The show will be led by locally based dance troupes. Keshet Chaim Dance Ensemble and Lula Washington Dance Theatre, and all ticket proceeds will support arts programs directed at youth and at bridging cultural and ethnic barriers through the arts.
